part 2

Use 3 of the beige 5" x 5" squares for block B.

Sew the brown strips for block B to this square.

6 pieces 5" x 1 1/2"

Sew each of these onto the left and right side of block B.

6 pieces 7" x 1 1/2"

Sew each of these onto the top and the bottom of block B.

Now you've got 3 of block B:

A beige square with brown strips around.



Find and use

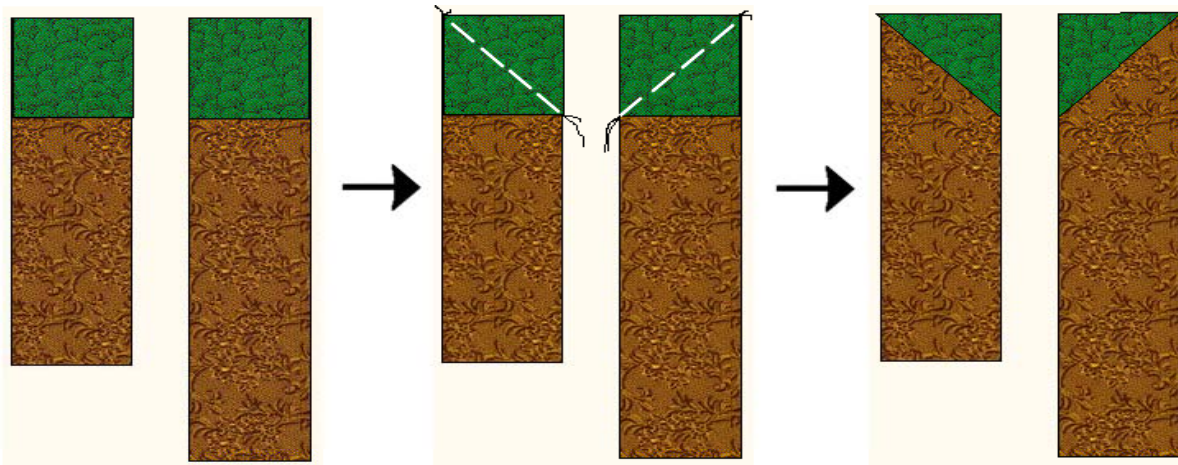
1 brown strip 5 1/2" x 1 1/2" and

1 brown strip 6 1/2" x 1 1/2"

Also find and use

2 dark green 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares.

Use connector squares* as an easy way to add triangle corners onto the rectangles and sew 2 dark green squares to the strips as shown.



Find and use

1 dark green 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" square.

Sew this dark green square to the end of the long the brown strip.

Find and use

5 brown strips 5 ½" x 1 ½" and

5 brown strips 6 ½" x 1 ½"

Also find and use

15 dark green 1 ½" x 1 ½" squares.

Repeat the steps as shown here before; - sew the brown strips and dark green squares together.

Now there are:

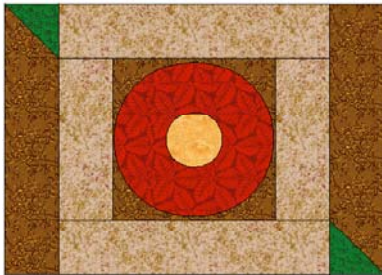
6 brown strips 5 ½" x 1 ½" with a green triangle at one end, and

6 brown strips 6 ½" x 1 ½" with a green triangle and a square at the end; - now 7 ½" long.

Find block A from the first part and

6 brown strips 5 ½" x 1 ½" with a green triangle at one end.

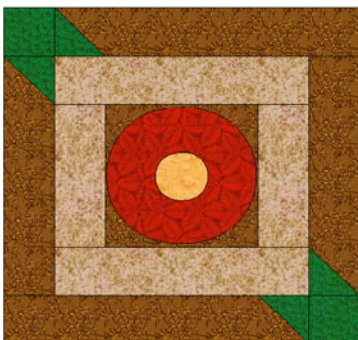
Sew each of these onto the left and right side of block A.



Find and use

6 brown strip with a green triangle and a square at the end; - now 7 ½" long.

Sew each of these onto the top and the bottom of block A..



This is block A, - you'll have 3 of these blocks now.
