

Baby Log Cabin Quilt

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Finished size: 25" x 25"

Sewing technique: Paper foundation piecing

Fabric requirements

An assortment of light blue, yellow, white, teal and pink scraps for the Log Cabin blocks.

Border 1 Pink - 4 strips 20" x 3/4" cutting size
Border 2 Blue - 2 strips 3 1/2" x whole width of fabric

Binding Teal - 2-1/2 strips from whole width of fabric
 - cut 2 1/4 wide for double binding

Thin batting: 25" x 25"

Backing 25" x 25"

3" Log Cabin block

you need 18 and 18 reversed foundations for this quilt
See page 2 for foundation pattern and color placement

Don't remove the foundation paper until you have added the first border, but do remove the paper from beneath the seam allowances after two units are sewn together.

Measurement
test
1 x 1 inch

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Adding the borders

Border 1 - Pink

Stitch one pink border strip to each side of the center - see diagram.

Stitch the remaining border strips to the top and to the bottom.

Press seams towards border.

Remove all paper foundations.

Border 2 - Blue

Measure the height of the block from raw edge to raw

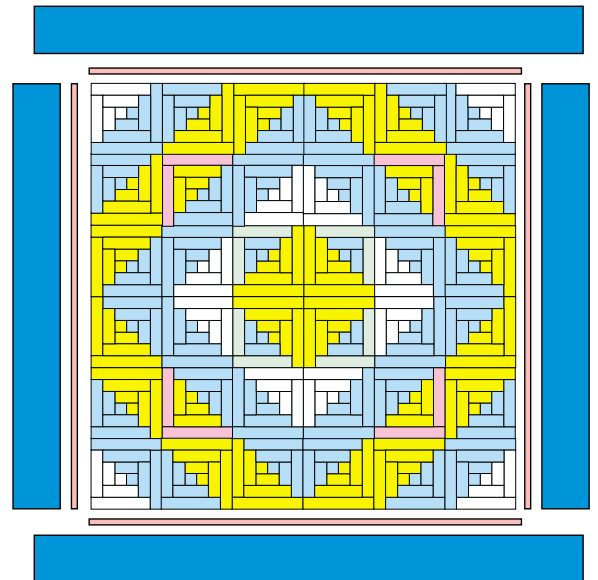
- cut 2 strips with this length

- Stitch to each side of the center block - see diagram.

- Measure from raw edge to raw edge and cut two more strips

- Stitch these strips to the top and the bottom.

- Press seams towards border.



Finish the quilt by layering backing, thin batting and quilt top.

Quilt as desired.

Finish the quilt with a ¼" finished double binding with mitered corners.

Label and date your work.

The size can be changed easily by adding more rows, or personalize the quilt by adding applique motifs like the name of the baby and date of birth.
